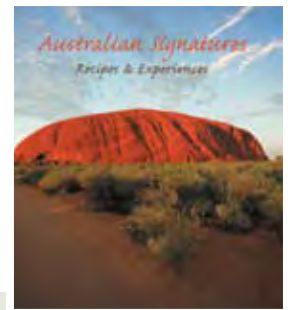
7. Cockington Green Gardens

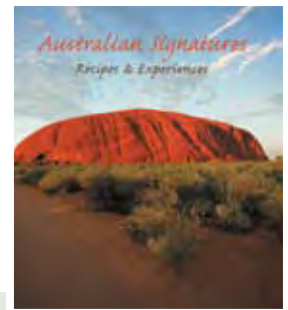
14. National Library of Australia
